This season also saw the formation of many new teams. A Junior six man R & R was fielded for the first time in many years. Three reserve boat crews and two junior boat crews were also formed as well as beach relay sides in all three divisions.

The branch championships were contested this year at Colloroy Beach and Southy had a particularly good day picking up one gold, two silver and four bronze medals. The metropolitan titles were conducted on the famous Bondi Beach and here we picked up one silver and two fifth places. The state titles were held at North Curl Curl and the surf ranged in size from about four to seven feet, not favouring some of our competitors. However, we managed a silver medal in the Junior Beach sprint.

The Australian Titles were held on a rocky beach in South Australia known as Moana. South Narrabeen sent one of its biggest teams in years comprising of almost forty members. Each of these guys and many other guys who couldn't make it raised every cent for the trip, some six thousand dollars. It was a magnificent effort. At these Championships the club showed how promising it is. We won our first Australian Championship in 29 years and had many others in finals and Semi Finals.

I would like to thank all the members of the club who supported the competitors and coaches over the last season. Also thank you to Col White for coaching Senior R & R and to Brett and Murray for forming and coaching the Junior R & R. To Chicka thank you for looking after all the guys in the beach area and to Torch and Peter Clarke for looking after and sweeping the boat crews. Also thanks to Ted and Pam Billet for their support.

It has been a long but magnificent season and lets hope next year that it is a better season for every one.
