TEAM MANAGER'S REPORT

The last season was a long and tiring one from a competitive point of view. The two trips this season were to the State titles in Wollongong and the National titles on the Gold Coast. The only championship medal that we won was when Lyndal Nuss crossed the line second in the Branch female beach sprint championship. Although it was certainly not through lack of trying, the boat crews were very unlucky not to have won medals at each of the championships. For the first time, we had two crews in a branch final with the reserve "B" crew making the semi finals of the State and the reserve "C" crew making the quarter finals of the Australian. With both crews competing next season and with luck on our side, I am sure we can pull off a championship. The junior crew rowed well under the guidance of Peter Hurley and at the National titles, showed they could row well when they put their minds to it.

Duncan (Smiley) Smith competed in the early part of the season with mixed success. He competed well in both the open belt race and the open iron man events reaching carnival finals almost every time. Smiley is to be congratulated on his efforts in marathon swimming finishing second in the Australian championships, winning the Magnetic Island race and being selected in the Australian team to contest the Cook Strait Challenge in New Zealand.

In the ski events, Phil Craig teamed up with Michael Bernauer to form the "dynamic duo" of the double ski scene. They met with mixed success this season but we hope to see them at it again next season.
