

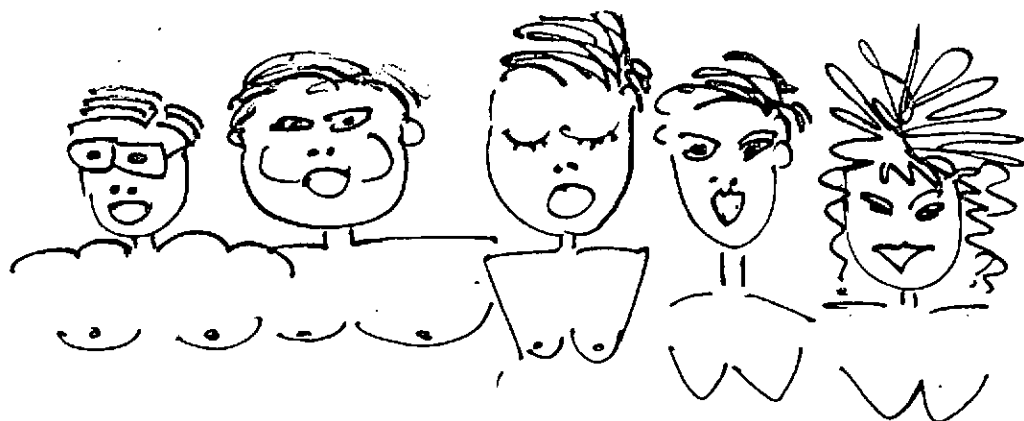
The aim of the social committee was not only to raise funds by providing functions and entertainment for members of all ages, but to help the club spirit grow and last but not least 'have a good time'.
