CAPTAIN'S REPORT

Once again South Narrabeen proved itself on the beach during the past season. Patrols were fairly well attended, a major Branch surf carnival was conducted at South Narrabeen and the purchase of new skis were among some of the achievements.

South Narrabeen held the Apple Manly-Warringah Branch IRB Championships in May. Being our first major surf carnival in many years it proved highly successful, and financially, it was a bonus to the club. My thanks to the carnival organiser, Cameron Taylor and those members who helped during the 2 day carnival. It has shown that a larger carnival would be within our capabilities.

New wave skis were purchased this season replacing the old equipment. 3 single wave skis (donated by the Solo ladies) and a double wave ski (donated by Taurian and Associates). These craft have proved popular with members.

The raffles at the Time and Tide have given South Narrabeen a sound financial footing this season, something we have struggled to get in recent years. This will enable South Narrabeen to purchase new equipment for the coming season. I appreciate the help given by Col Mack, manager of the Time and Tide and by members who turn up each week to run the raffles.

Patrols as I have mentioned earlier were well attended but some members are still disregarding their patrol obligations, for which they were penalised. There was a fall off in attendance towards the end of the season. This does cause undue pressure on other members to fill this gap. This problem will be watched closely next season as the 1987/88 season will be longer, from 26th September to Anzac Day. However this problem could be resolved with the recruitment of new members (a priority next season).

Rescues were minimal this season with our major problem being windsurfers blown out to sea in a stiff breeze. Hopefully these people will show more common-sense next season. The IRB crews proved their seamanship being involved in rescues from North Narrabeen to Collaroy on some days.

Awards were not as many as we hoped for but it was good to see the new members from Pittwater House gain their bronze awards. One squad of three gained their ARC awards and 5 members passed their IRB drivers and crew awards.

South Narrabeen was still heavily involved in competition this season with only the A crew going to Perth and making it through to the 3rd round of the Australian Championships well done! South Narrabeen came 4th in the Branch Patrol Competition. Also our first Branch Champion for many years, Ivor Kenny 3rd in the Cadet Surfboard Riding, congratulations. It is good to see members get more involved and diversifying in other areas of competition such as ski paddling, run-swim-run and IRB Racing. Keep up the good work.

As I will not be standing for Club Captain next season I wish to thank those members who have helped and supported me over the past four seasons.

- A donation by the Late F A Bertram, which supported our Photo Restoration programme
- A donation by the Time and Tide Hotel which covered boat transport costs to the Australian Titles in WA
- Consistent monthly donations by the ladies who run the Solo Club on Wednesdays

Major purchases with some of the above money included:

- 3 new single wave skis
- 1 new double wave ski
- 1 new IRB motor
- Subsidising the travel costs of our Australian Titles competitors
- Extensive repairs to some valued photographs
