Competition Report

Down at South Narrabeen the Surf Boat section has been re-building over the last couple of years with a focus on bringing younger rowers through Junior and Colts crews.

This season we were represented by three boat crews in three separate divisions. Some of the results that were achieved throughout the year were promising, which we hope to be improved upon next season.

The three crews rowed at Carnivals all over New South Wales, and of course the annual trip to the Gold Coast for the Australian Titles, which this year tossed up some unbelievable surf conditions that were handled by all three crews.

Rowing Surf Boats is about committing to a cause with other individuals, then training as a unit to achieve desired results. However we do have a fair bit of fun along the journey, which includes a few trips away. This season we competed at Carnivals in Wollongong, Newcastle, Pacific Palms, Gold Coast and of course many Carnivals throughout the Sydney metro area.

The Junior crew (U19's) were capably swept by JC (John Clark), with Mat (stroke), Lloyd (2nd stroke), Kieran (2nd Bow) and Heath (Bow). Although this is the crews second year together, it was Lloyd's first year in a boat, which obviously took the boys some time to get used to. Their best result of the year was a second at the Freshwater carnival in solid 4 – 6 foot surf. The boys also rowed well at the Australian Titles, rowing on the Friday at Kirra Beach, after carnival was moved due to surf conditions. The boys won their first race and were swept skillfully by JC before racing was called off for the day. Hopefully this bunch of young men will stick together and come up with some quality results in their last year as a Junior Crew.

The Colts crew (U23 men) were also swept by JC, with Tuck (stroke), Jim (2nd stroke), Bryce (2nd bow), Olly (Bow). This was the Colts second year together, their average age is below 21. These boys row in a really tough division of racing, not only is the quality of crews in this division very high they are rowing against men 2 years their senior (Olly and Tuck could still row Juniors). The rowing of these boys has improved markedly throughout the last two years to a point where they would like to claim to be the fastest crew in the Club however this scribe would beg to differ, perhaps next season this claim could be quantified if they all have a go and train a little harder. The Colts also achieved some solid results throughout the year however they also saved their best row of the year for the Australian Titles by winning their heat on Thursday in massive surf before the event was postponed.

Competition Report

The third crew of our team was the B Crew, swept by myself (Moose), with Fluff (stroke), Steve (2nd stroke), Micka (2nd Bow), Luke (Bow). These boys have rowed for many years together and agreed at the start of the season to not start until December. In hindsight this was probably a mistake as the standard of the reserve surf boat division is also excellent with the most amount of crews to beat each week. These boys also achieved a second at the Freshwater Carnival and rowed very well at the State Titles to reach the fourth round before being knocked out from a crew behind on a sneaky wave (that's surf boats). At the Australian Titles we managed to get hammered twice, got out once, broke a sweep oar, and sweep rowlock but managed to get through the day. Hopefully the B crew who represents South Narrabeen next season will start a bit earlier and the results will definitely come.

Surf Boat rowing is not only about achieving good results but also about commitment to training, to each other, enjoying some good times together and also making a positive contribution to the Surf Club. I believe on most levels we have achieved these things as a group, this year we definitely have a good time in each other's company, all of the rowers have represented the Club when away very well, they are all very decent individuals who I am proud to be associated with.

There are always a few people to thank throughout a season of rowing. JC needs a massive pat on the back for taking on two crews (Juniors & Colts) with the birth of a new son, his lovely partner Zoe has been very understanding. JC has also been heavily involved with the development of plans for the renovation to the Club and has put many unrecognized hours into this massive task.

Rohan Fisher did not row this year however that did not stop a bloke like Rohan from staying involved, he undertook his Official's course and officiated at many surf boat Carnivals throughout the year. A great effort from a really nice bloke who is always willing to assist when required. Let's hope Rohan finds his way back into a crew for next season.

Whilst on the topic of officials, Tony (Torch) and Thec Haven were again seen on the beach numerous times, carrying out their official duties with aplomb. Torch was appointed the Boat Referee for the Australian Titles this year and didn't he have his hands full with the conditions and the controversy surrounding the event. A job well done Torch and Thec, thanks again from all the rowers.

Support on the beach is always appreciated. This year Mick Cross and his family attended many Carnivals, including the Australian Titles, the photos attached to this report of the rowers are all courtesy of Mick and his accurate lens. Mick, Martha and kids are a welcome addition to the South Narrabeen rowing family. Thanks for all your support throughout the year.

Lastly I would like to mention a competitor from another Club who most of us did not know, his name is Saxon Bird. He competed for Queenscliff Surf Club and lost his life on the Friday of the Australian Titles whilst competing. A tragic loss of life, our thoughts are with his family and friends. We all take a risk when going out into the surf but none of us expect to give our lives. Rest in peace Saxon.

Nippers Report

South Narrabeen Nippers again had a good year on the sand. Our Nipper numbers this year were around 95 Nippers registered. While these numbers were a little down on the previous year, we didn't see as many drop outs in the second half of the year as we have previously so it felt pretty similar to last year overall. As always there was particularly strong representation from the younger age groups which have a very good balance of enough Nippers to give some great competition but not too many so that there is too much time waiting around.

The 2 big social events of the year are our Halloween party and Christmas party which were again very well attended. The kids love dressing up for Halloween and it has become a real South Narrabeen tradition to do so. It is a real differentiator for us as a Club that we have a successful social side, as the majority of Clubs can't or don't deliver on this aspect. The "fun" aspect to Nippers culminated on our last day on the sand with the construction of a fantastic obstacle course designed by Silvana Stephen. We had hurdles, balance beams, cargo nets, sack hopping and zig zag running, all while "supportive" parents squirted water blasters at the competitors. It was great fun.

Following on from last year, we continued a strong focus on board skills this year in an effort to get more of the older Nippers into the water and out on the boards. We introduced board training as a regular event before Nippers on a Sunday with the first half of the year spent building basic skills and strength on the flat water of Narrabeen Lake before tackling the surf later in the season. The surf conditions were generally favourable all year allowing us to get the Nippers out on the boards and swimming on most Sunday mornings. It was fantastic to get to the stage later in the season where the majority of older Nippers were out in the water keeping the water safety guys busy. Our efforts also translated into regular competitors in the water at the carnivals.

Narrabeen Club again joined us on two Sundays to hold combined Nippers days at our respective Clubs. It was great to pool our numbers, provide support to each other and get a bit of healthy competition with our friendly neighbours.

The carnivals were well attended throughout the season and it was great to give our Nippers the experience of competing with all the bigger Clubs. As a small Club we don't expect to mix it with larger highly competitive Clubs, but we had a pleasing array of finalists and semi-finalists in a variety of events and ages without coming home with any medals from Branch.

For the first time this year we instituted the Nipper of the Year award which was presented to one male and one female Nipper. The award was judged by the committee based on consistent participation and excellence at Club competition on Sundays, participation and results at carnivals, general sportsmanship and participation and supporting of Club events. This year's awards went to Kye Conna and Arlia Patterson.

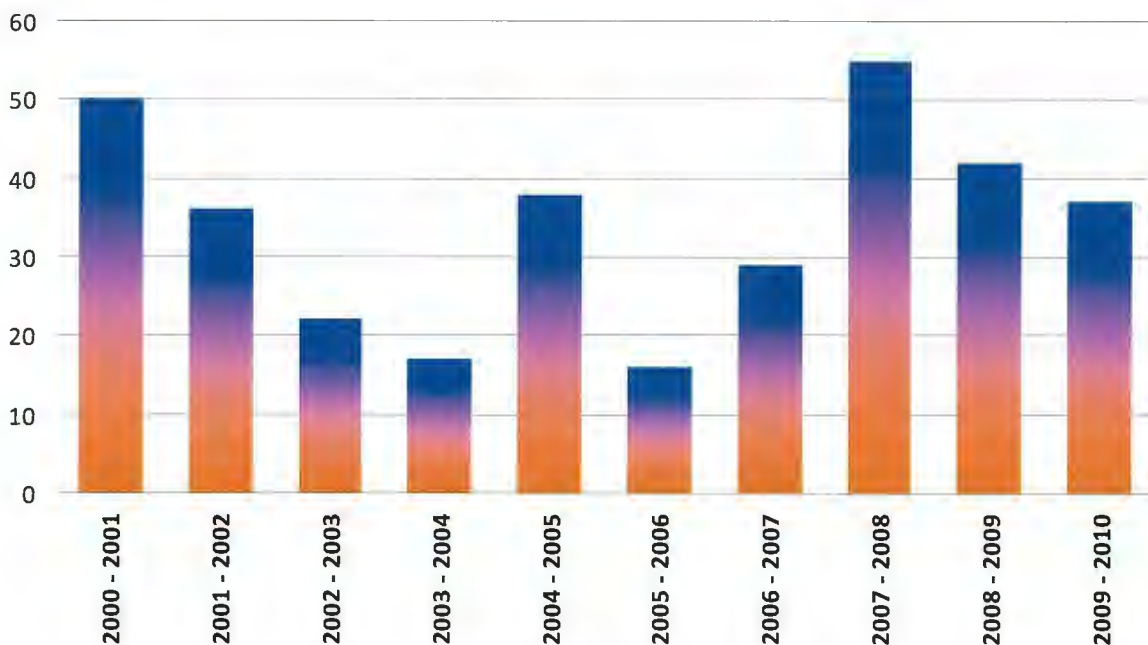
Nippers Report

Max joined South Narrabeen SLSC in 1937 gained his Bronze Medallion on the 27th November 1938. Max demonstrated to all in the Surf Life Saving family that he was an outstanding surf life saver from the day he joined.

He was a diligent patrol captain elected the Club captain in 1944/45 season. He was a member of a number surf life saving education teams in the late 1940's visiting Tasmania and Victoria teaching life saving resuscitation and first aid.

Max was an outstanding competitor for South Narrabeen he was in the Australian Championship R&R team in 1945/46 also in the team was Frank Collins who played football with Max at North Sydney. Max also finished second the great Don Morrison from Cottesloe in the Australian belt championships in 1947/48.

In the NSW championships Max was a member of South Narrabeen's R&R that won the State Title in 1940/41. He was also the NSW belt champion in 1946/47 and 1947/48. Max was also a member of a number of NSW surf life saving competition teams including the first NSW team in 1946/47.

Max was always working for South Narrabeen SLSC organising and featuring in wrestling events that were run in the car park of the Club these were the prime source of income for the Club in those years.

It was while competing for South Narrabeen that he was spotted and made the body of Chesty Bond.

Max went onto become a lifeguard at Manly using those exceptional skills that he had demonstrated as a competitor and whilst patrolling South Narrabeen. Max received the great honour of being elected as a Life Member of South Narrabeen SLSC in 1956.

We at South Narrabeen remember Max as one of our truly great surf Lifesavers.
