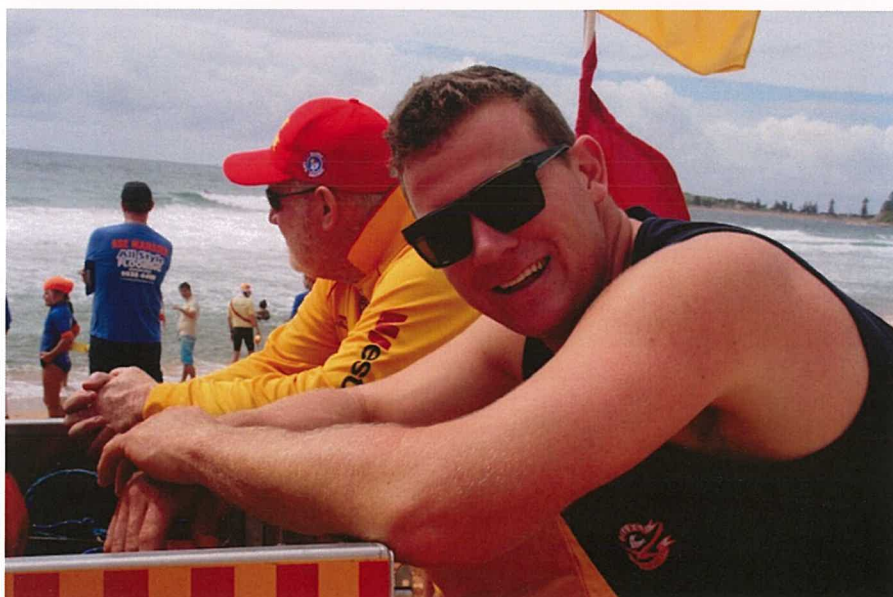

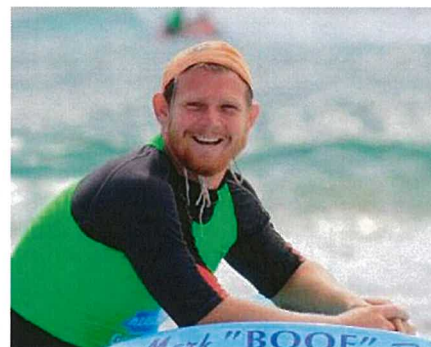

Clubbie Of The Year 2011

(extract from Rob Stokes address to the NSW Legislative Assembly 13th October 2011)

economic contribution of surf lifesaving on Sydney's northern beaches is an incredible \$477 million. This figure includes not only the value of the time of volunteer lifesavers but also a government-based figure on the value of a saved life and permanent incapacitation. It includes the value of volunteering time, personal expenditure, the value of lives saved, the reduction in permanent incapacitation and the flow-on effect of surf life saving activities. The report by PricewaterhouseCoopers demonstrates that for every dollar invested in surf lifesaving there is a \$29 economic benefit, so we literally have a saltwater economy where surf lifesaving is concerned.

I conclude with one tangible personal story of the real benefit of surf lifesaving. I want to boast about Andy Cross from South Narrabeen. Andy is a magnificent bloke and a wonderful lifesaver. He was just voted the nation's favourite surf lifesaver. Andy Cross won the inaugural Nikon Clubbie of the Year award, with a huge boost in funding to the excellent South Narrabeen club in which he is involved. He is the chief instructor at South Narrabeen Surf Life Saving Club and has made an enormous contribution to that club both in training bronze medallion holders and nippers, and as chief instructor. I congratulate and thank everyone involved in surf lifesaving in Pittwater. I am keen for this House to explore new ways that it and the Parliament can engage with the surf life saving movement and I note the idea of a parliamentary friends of surf life saving, which is in operation at the Federal level. With more clubs in New South Wales than in any other State, I think it is something that we need to look at.

Community Engagement Report

1. **Pub to pub** – held on the 28 August, 2011 & about 15 of our boaties assisted the members of the Rotary Club in providing traffic control & supplying water to the runners. The surf club has been involved in this project for a number of years.
2. **Trivia night** – held on the 25 November 2011 at the surf club for all community members. This was a fund raiser by our boaties to raise funds for a new boat. Organized mainly by the lady rowers they did a great job in attracting some fabulous prizes & over 80 local people attended. It was a great night with a lot of laughs & frivolity.
3. **Artwork show** – held at the surf club from 2 - 4 December with local artwork painted by local artists & displayed over the weekend at the surf club – Official opening of the Exhibition was conducted by Andy Cross who officially opened the exhibition & spoke fluent Korean out of respect for the hirers. The Ocean View Room was transformed into a magnificent art gallery over the weekend & the same hirers have booked for next season.
4. **Bush to beach** – the club held the 7th annual program between the 27 & 30 January, 2012 whereby 40 Aboriginal children from the Outback attended the club for the weekend. It was a tremendous weekend with many community members assisting, including members of the Variety Club, boaties, and nipper parents, senior & junior members of the club. Some of the highlights of the weekend were a flyover at the beach by the Westpac Helicopter, a shark sighting between the flags & a successful rescue (after patrol hours) whereby 'Kaylan 11 yr old Brewarrina boy sighted a swimmer in distress & caught in an ugly rip. Kaylan ran to the clubhouse where numerous Club members Andy Cross & Matt Fordham & other swung into action & saved the patient. The patient was taken by ambulance to Hospital where stayed overnight but returned the next day to thank the club members & Kaylan.
5. **Andy Cross** – winning the Nikon 'Clubbie of the year' received the highest votes of any Lifesaver in Australia for this Award. Great input from the club members, supporters & the general public.
6. **Australia Day Festival** – held on the 26 January at Berry Park a community event took place & nipper parents etc assisted in rubber duckie rides & general fun activities i.e. thong throwing competition & the junior thong throwing competition was won by our own young nipper 'Jemima'. About 20 nipper parents & 40 nippers attended this event.
7. **New surf boat launching** – held on the 5 February & a crowd of about 120 people attended. The boat was primarily sponsored by The Sands Hotel & other sponsors

included Winning Appliances, MS Interiors, Gotcha Covered The boat was named after Mark 'Boof' Dimento who is a Life Member of the club & is well deserving of the Award. A huge surf was running on the day however the boaties got the new boat in & out without any mishap. One of the special guests was Joe Garvin 93old who is the oldest surviving member of the Club & travelled all the way from the Central Coast by public transport & by all accounts he had a tremendous time.

8. **Ocean View Hall hire** – on the 11 March local Variety Club members hired the hall for a fundraiser & over 150 people attended the function with the serving of a paella dish. The entertainment was provided by a local band including the local Korean community providing a 12yr old boy to sing for the group. The function was well received & funds were raised which will help sick or disabled children in the community.
9. **Mt. Druitt Indigenous Choir** - this is a group of local children who operate out of the Mt Druitt PCYC & approached the Club as they wanted to enjoy a day at the beach & also see & learn how a surf club operates. On the 24 March we had a visit by a bus load of teenagers from out west & none of them had been to the northern beaches before. At the club they were given a tour of the beach, learnt about surf safety & got to learn how a surf club operates.
10. **Second visit Mt. Druitt Indigenous Choir** - due to hospitality shown by the Club in March the group requested to attend the Club again & this time bring a larger group. On the 22 April 40 children & 12 adults attended the Club on a sunny day however the beach was closed due to the hazardous surf conditions. Mick Cross the Patrol Captain was consulted along with the Collaroy SLSC & the group was moved to Collaroy Pool. It wasn't long before the group started moving into the surf & many of them were apprehensive on the first trip but now had gained more confidence in the surf. Mick & Andy Cross arranged for some newly appointed 'bronzies' to attend the Collaroy Pool & provided re-assurance of water safety to the parents. All the patrol members on the day went out of their way to ensure the beach visit was enjoyable & as safe possible.



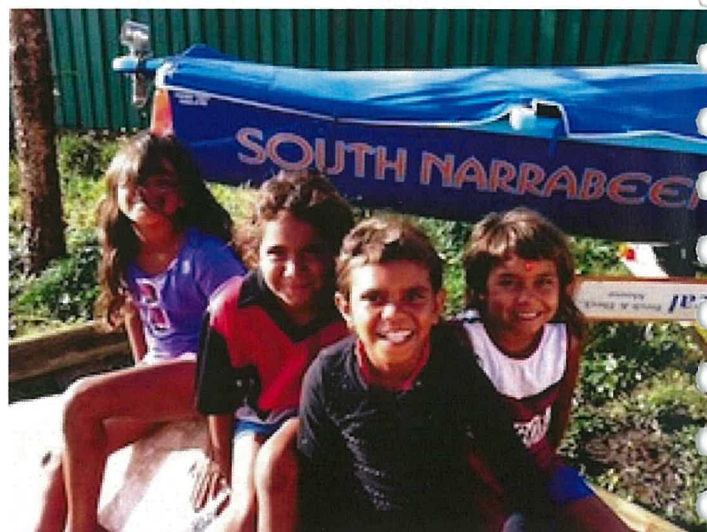
Committee & Nick Brice:

SURF LIFESAVING

Kaylan, 11, saves man

BOY FROM BREWARRINA PRAISED FOR HIS ACTIONS AFTER INITIATING BEACH RESCUE

IF IT weren't for the quick thinking of young Kaylan Murray, Sang Hyun Park may have lost his life in the waves at Narrabeen Beach.

The 11-year-old Aboriginal boy from Brewarrina, western NSW, was on the beach when he noticed Mr Park, 50, in the water.

Mr Park was about 50m out from shore, waving in distress about 1pm.

"As I was sitting down having a feed, in the corner of my eye I could see a person waving," he said. "He was in trouble."

Kaylan sprang into action, running 40m to raise the alarm with chief lifesaving instructor Andy Cross at South Narrabeen Surf Life Saving Club.

Mr Cross and colleague Matt Forthum dashed into the surf, pulling a barely conscious Mr Park from a rip taking him out to sea.

Kaylan was at the beach as part of the Bush to Beach program, which ran a weekend trip to the northern beaches as a reward for children who stayed in school and behaved themselves in their community.

With no patrol on the beach at the time, Mr Cross said Kaylan was instrumental in saving Mr Park.

"Right from Kaylan, it was a team effort from South Narrabeen that got Mr Park walking," he said.

Jack Cassano, who founded the Bush to Beach program, said water safety awareness Kaylan was taught over the weekend meant Mr Park got the help he needed.

"A young boy listened and, because of his common sense, someone is alive today," he said. "Kaylan is the hero in this. It was just a great team effort."

Mr Park spent the night in hospital after his rescue and returned to the surf club yesterday to thank Kaylan and everyone at South Narrabeen.

Grandmother grateful to trio for rescue

COLLABOY grandmother Julie Ward is eternally grateful to three unknown young men who saved her grandson from a tidal rip on Friday evening.

Mrs Ward, 70, said 11-year-old Matthew, her brother and cousin were playing on a sandbank at Collaboy Beach when Mr Park was knocked over by a wave and pulled out to sea

at about 6.30pm. "I was so terrified, I can't tell you," she said.

"In my 70 years it was the worst thing that happened to me."

Matthew's brother, Benjamin, and cousin Jack made it to shore but Matthew was being pulled out, much to the distress of his grandmother.

As Mrs Ward stood screaming on the beach, three young men "came out of nowhere" to help Matthew.

The three men went into the surf with a bodyboard to pluck the boy from the rip and bring him to shore.

"I have no doubt they saved his life," she said.

"It was just one of those horrible events that could have ended really badly."

The men left before Mrs Ward had the chance to properly thank them and she hoped to reach them to

express her gratitude.

"To Matthew and his extended family, they will always be heroes," she said.

Mrs Ward also thanked police, paramedics, a nurse from Shipmates units who checked Matthew and a woman on the beach who

conducted Mrs Ward during the incident.

To Grant Shapcott we have never been in better shape with IRB drivers and crew and the condition of the craft and motors is top class.

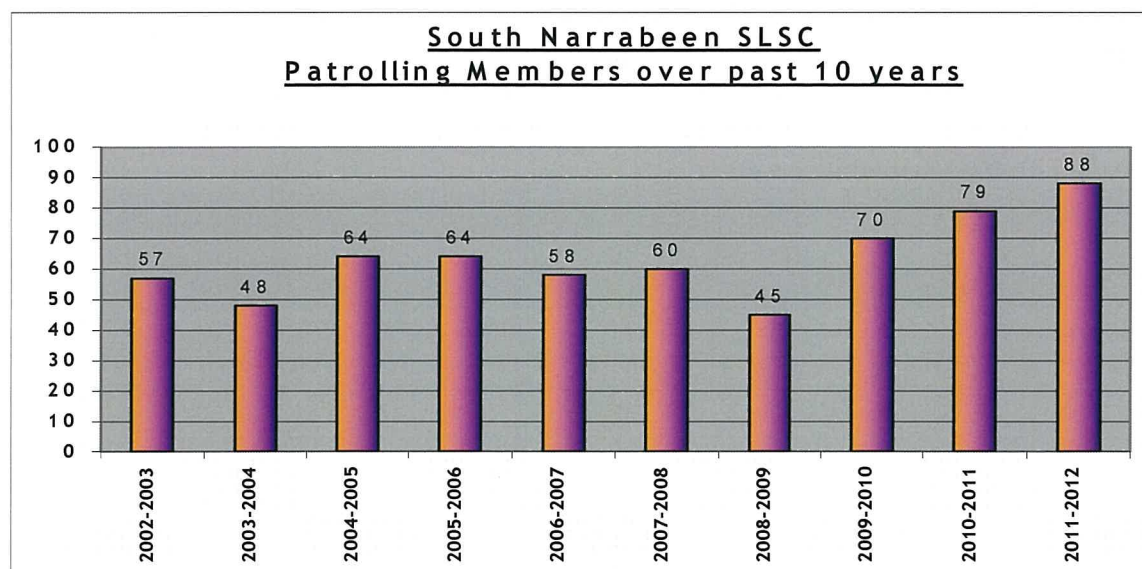
To President Rohan and my fellow Directors thanks for your support without it would we would not be where we are with life saving.

Financial Summary

The Club is in terrific financial shape posting an operating profit of \$46,910.44 before depreciation for the year or \$27,664.24 after depreciation.

As of the 30th April 2012 the Club had \$24,549.92 in deposit interest bearing account and a total of \$70,000 invested in term deposits all with Westpac Bank.

Key Events during the Year

Facility Development Program – Stage I (downstairs) \$273,165.82

As reported the Club was successful in receiving a grant of \$270,000 in March 2010 from Surf Lifesaving NSW, to assist with the cost of the Club's extensions for an upgrade to amenities and the establishment of appropriate female facilities. This work was completed in March with final sign off and payment to be made May.

Capital Investment - Plant & Equipment \$62,019.283

This year the Committee continued to invest heavily into the future of the Club and its members. The areas where investment occurred were, Life saving \$24,628.91, Competition \$25,417.82, Nippers \$6,013.64 and Gym \$6,030.91.

Donations, Grants and Gifts – \$53,225.45

During the year the Club received tremendous support in the form of cash donations, fund raising, grants and sponsorship. We wish to thank all those who have contributed, we continue to be extremely grateful and look forward to a long and healthy partnership. Please see summary at end of treasure's report.

RESCUE, RESCUE, RESCUE

What a season for saving lives. All the education, teamwork and surf skills paid off this year with over 35 rescues. 13 of the rescues were done on 5th February in a 2.5hrs period on a 1.5KM stretch of the beach at South Narrabeen this was done by Patrol 1C well done girls. In the State of NSW the 5th February was also a record day for rescues and preventions for Surf Life Saving.

Congratulations to all patrolling members, patrol captains, our group captains, Torch our club captain and of course Rohan our club president. Our patrol inspections this year were off the chart, with 2 perfect 200's and the other inspections were in high 180's and 190's. Sensational effort everyone.

We had other great rescues 3 of which went up for rescues of the month to the branch. All rescues were successful due to the fantastic teamwork that our South Narrabeen patrols thrive on. Some of the rescues included:

The girls patrol 1C with 13 rescues assisted by Rohan Fisher, Angie Thorpe, Jess Brealey, Emily Bojko.

Grant and Troy picking up in the IRB three 21yr guys 200m north of the flags assisted his patrol by Nathan Madden and a mate on body boards.

It was after patrol had shut down. Kaylan 12yrs from Brewarrana set off the alarm that two Korean guys caught in a rip 100m north of the club. Matt Fordham and a few other members raced down we got the guys in and to our delight the whole club jumped into action. After one of the men spent a night in hospital he survived and returned to thank everyone at the club.

Grant and Mike in the IRB picked up A 21yrs male 100m south of the flags who had been rescued just one month prior by Rohan Fisher. We offered him a spot in our bronze squad.

Michael Bojko new bronze just 16yrs who successfully did his first rescue just of the north end of the flags a 35yrs male caught in a rip Mike swam into action with a tube and got to him he was backed up with rescue boards from the life guard and his patrol.

Ken Passmore on a roving patrol in the ATV 100m south of the flags spotted a girl in trouble and flew into action with the tube to bring her in safely.

Everyone at the club who helped in getting young 9yr old Jayden in from the surf after being knocked out by his board, caring for him while waiting for the Ambulance.

There were several others that occurred, countless preventions and first aids completed it just means that South Narrabeen is prepared and ready at all times to keep the beach safe, well done everyone.

We had a wonderful season for new Bronze and SRC holders. We had twenty new bronze holders and four SRC who want to go on and do Bronze congratulations and welcome to Surf Life Saving.

Additionally many patrolling members completed the Senior First Aid course, IRB crew and driver course, Spinal Management, Basic Beach Management and the ARTC course. Congratulations and well done.

Congratulations on everyone on attaining their awards this season.

Thank you so very much the funds will go directly into new equipment for the band which is desperately needed.

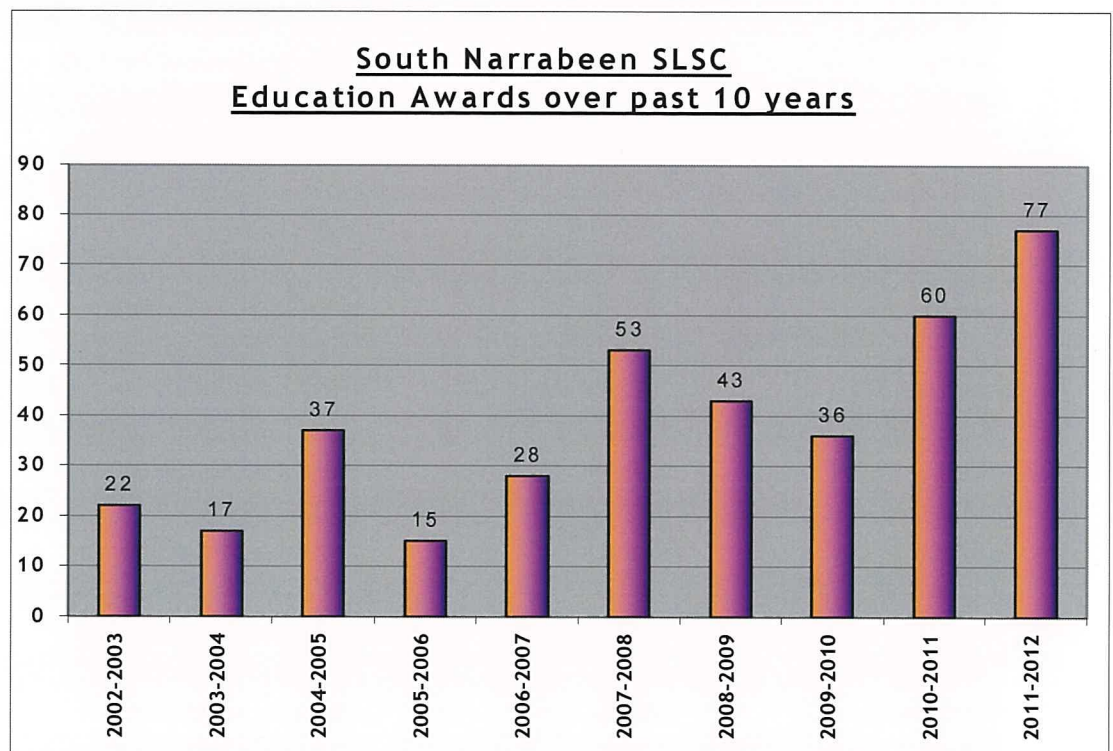

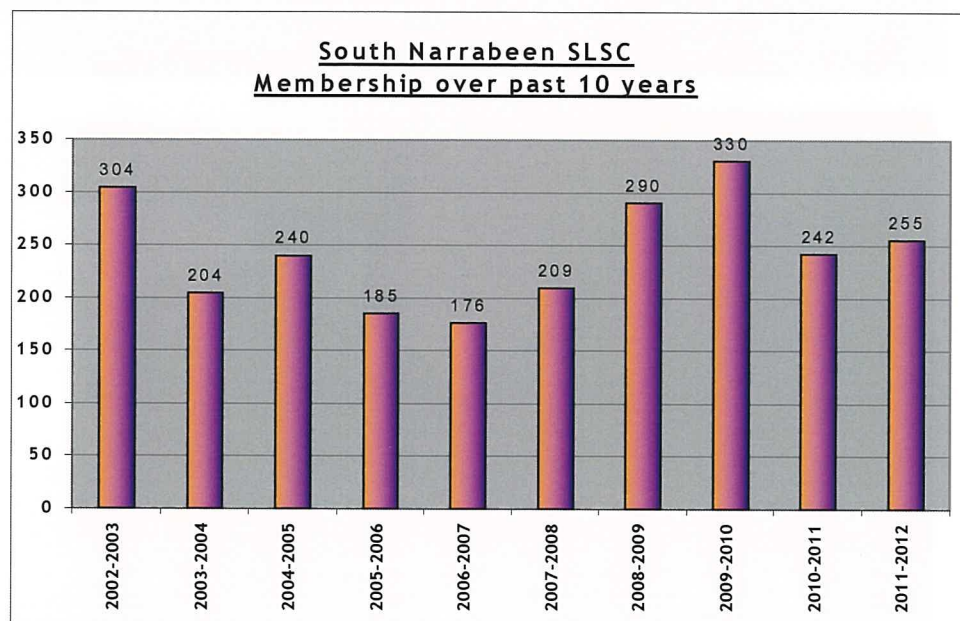

A TRIBUTE TO A SUPER CLUBBIE

My name is Rohan Fisher and I am the president of South Narrabeen SLSC. I feel very honoured to be here today and say a few words on behalf of our club.

Within the four years that Nick was a member of our club, he had achieved every qualification that surf life saving has to offer. Nick's achievements were simply unheard off. Nick joined our club in 2008 and immediately became part of our family. If there was any task that needed to be completed Nick would always volunteer. From digging the storm water drain, to sweeping sand at the club, nothing was too much to ask.

I first met Nick in 2009 after returning from an overseas trip. His attitude, dedication and commitment highlighted the true asset he was to our club. These qualities that Nick presented had him in line to be our next club captain. A position that Nick would have excelled in.

There wasn't a summer weekend that went by where Nick was a no show at the club. I remember ringing Nick one day to ask if he was available to help out with a patrol on the weekend, and instead of saying just a simple no, he went on to tell me how he was volunteering for the SES and Rural Fire Brigade and that he was extremely sorry that he couldn't be of assistance. This was an example of how much he loved our club and was always willing to assist in any way he could.

Last year Nick attended the Branch awards night along with other members of the club. When the MYPP award was announced it was stated that the recipient had achieved a total of 120 voluntary hours. And to our amusement Nick's comment was (and I quote) "120hrs....that's nothing. I've done 160hrs so he should just come and give that award to me" And Nick was right. Over the 6months period from October - March when our club provides a patrol for the beach, an average person would complete around 50-60hrs. Nick had achieved these hours by Christmas. Nick was a finalist for the MYPP for the 2010/2011 only to be pipped at the post by another young male who was of the same calibre as our Nick.

Nick was always asking what more he could do around the club and at the start of this year he assumed the role of our First Aid Officer. A role that Nick was so dedicated too. Every time I would walk into the first aid room, Nick would be in there making sure everything was in order. As a President I couldn't ask for anything more. We recently had our annual gear inspection which Nick played a major part in. Nick spent weeks prior to the inspection making sure that not only the first aid gear was ready but assisted the Gear Steward in his duties. Nick was there on the Sunday morning in Rural Fire Gear as he had just come from a volunteer shift with his Belrose Unit. Nick needed no guidance in what needed to be done. He laid all the gear on the grass in front of the club, walked around with the inspectors once they arrived and then packed it all away.

Not only did Nick have a passion for SLS, he also showed us that he was a whiz in the kitchen. On numerous occasions he would come to patrol bearing very delicious dessert for us to sample. I remember over hearing him asking one of the many taste testers what they thought about the particular dessert they were sampling and asking how he could improve and before they could response he has answered his own question with "Oh I think it needed more flour because it didn't rise in the oven at the temperature it should of" Again another example of his dedication not only to his peers and hobbies but to himself.

Nick attended another function with the surf club in July this year. For some reason Nick was running late. As he arrived he was wearing this bright orange suit jacket. When questioning Nick about his lateness he informed me that he had only just finished sewing the jacket about 1hr ago. I recall Nick talk to Di about the jacket asking her what she thought about his sewing and if she had any tips for him.

Not having Nick around our club has come at a shock to all of us. We gathered together on Tuesday night after hearing the news of this tragedy and reminisced about the good times we all had with Nick around.

My last involvement with Nick was Sunday morning last week when a group of the club members decided to take the Rescue Boats out for a drive as the surf was a good size for some fun. Nick was my crewman at one point and I remember driving towards the shore and suddenly turning the boat only to have Nick fall over the side and into the water but instead of letting go he held on and managed to pull himself back in and basically said lets do that again.

Nick you will always hold a special place in our hearts, not only as a patrolling member but as a brother, son, grandson (according to some of our life members who could not be here today) and most of all just a great guy. You have touch so many of us in ways I can honestly say that will never happen again. We know you are up with your brother Chris having a great time.

We miss you mate!
