- To minimise the loss of life from downing by carrying out surf patrols to render all aid possible to those in distress.
- To promote demonstrations and arrange classes of instruction in the principles of surf life saving and resuscitation.
- To encourage amateur sports, carnival competition, and social functions, etc which do not interfere with the life saving duties of members.
- To foster youth development in a supportive family environment by providing education, competition and social activities for children.
- To enter into arrangements or contracts with any government, local government or other body for any of the purposes of the Club.
- To acquire or otherwise deal with land, buildings, leases, personal property, interests or rights with the object of furthering the interests of the Club.
- To carry on any other activities whatsoever calculated directly or indirectly to enhance further the interests of the Club such that profits are expended in furtherance of these Objectives only.
- To strive for governmental and public recognition of Surf Life Saving as the authority on aquatic safety.
- To promote the health and safety of members and users of the aquatic environment.

The hot dry summer has increased beach attendance and there were fewer large surf days where the beach had to be closed. We have fulfilled our Lifesaving commitment with another year of 'No lives lost'. Whilst our patrol numbers are slightly lower over last season we contributed more hours patrolling the beach. We are indebted to the 7 patrol teams, and to each member of our patrols teams and on behalf of your Club and Community I would like to say thank you for a job well done.

Rescue of the Year—Simon Learmonth

On a late December overcast afternoon at South Narrabeen, the sea conditions were moderate with strong winds with two large rips either side of the red and yellow flags. Polish young man entered the water (initially in the flagged area) wading out to the sandbank wearing a full face snorkel. Rather than swimming between the flags he swam to the left of the sandbank, out of the flagged area and into a rip. The patient was beginning to panic and swim against the rip when Simon, who was patrolling on the sand, took to the water with a rescue board to pick up the swimmer. The patient was picked up without injury and before the situation escalated.


Too few doing too much.

BUILDING REPORT

It's been a very busy season for the Building Development Committee. We have had the Development Application approved for the Training Room, Eastern Stairs and the Awning over the Eastern Balcony. Also the Construction Certificate has been approved for the Awning on the Eastern Balcony and the Awning erected.

The Council building works for the lift commenced also in May and is due for completion in September. With installation of the lift this has allowed for the expansion of the gym and also the upgrading for the gym area.

The training room and the eastern stairs will be constructed in the winter of 2020. During the construction of the stairs on the eastern side the café will be closed.

Our President Martin has been working with Council on the re-construction of the car park and this will provide up to 20 car parking spaces and this will also include a number of spaces for volunteer's lifesavers who are on patrol. Also the Council will be repainting the exterior of the club. These two projects will be funded by Northern Beaches Council.

Northern Beaches Council will also over the next twelve months construction the sea wall from Collaroy to Goodwin Street Narrabeen. Council has asked for input from the Club for the layout of the park in front of the club.

There are a number of other projects in their embryo stage on the clubhouse upgrading the Public Amenities, rebuilding the Lifeguard area.

The Ocean View Room is also having an upgrade over the winter period being repainted, new tables and chairs. Also the room will be recarpeted along with the stairs and also the parquetry will be sanded and polished.

- Number of Rescues 9 (No Gear 4, Rescue tube 2, Rescue board 2, IRB 1)
- Number of Preventions 1923

Three key accomplishments this season for South Narrabeen SLSC patrols, firstly there were no lives lost on our beach. Additionally, our patrol teams have been diligent in their attendance and I am pleased to report we achieved 100% patrol sign on and no patrol breaches. This is a credit to all our patrol members and their willingness to adapt to the ever changing conditions at South Narrabeen Beach.

This year we completed our Skills Maintenance between September and the end of December. Thank you to Jake Warner, Richard Dowling, Grant Shapcott and Brian Grudy for their assistance in this area. Jake covered SRC, BM and ARTC along with me and Richard with Grant and Brian taking care of the IRB Crew. IRB REPORT

Well the 2018/19 season was a pretty full one from the IRB side of things. We did pick up the IRB training again through winter and managed to get 2 drivers through on 6 October 2018 at Collaroy as the conditions were way too big at Southie. Congratulations to Max Stephen and Connor Shapcott for obtaining their IRB Driver Silver medallion in what were still some very tricky launching conditions at Collaroy. Unfortunately Andrew Ivering was not available for this assessment but he successfully obtained his Driver award a couple of weeks later at Warriewood, again is some challenging conditions-well done to all.

We then ran an IRB Crew course soon after in December 2018, typically these courses are run every weekend over many weeks to gain the experience and skill required to be competent. But this time we trialled an intensive course over two weekends, a total of two full days training with a 3rd day as a refresher (if needed) then the assessment on the 4th day Sunday. We had some very



challenging surf over both weekends with beaches closed and on the assessment day the surf was so big that we had to complete the assessment at Long reef where the conditions were a lot more pleasant. Getting the IRB from Southie to Long Reef was however a totally different story though, as battling 6ft plus surf, strong NE winds and lots of chop put a whole new meaning to the word pounded.

This was the first time we had tried an intensive course like this and I have to acknowledge and thank the course participants Maddie Clacy, Phillip Moffitt, Daniel Li, Joe Predergast, Jess Parrot and Bianca Sparks for their dedication and commitment through the training. It was great fun, a special thanks has to go to Brian Grundy who's knowledge and assistance with these courses is invaluable and very much appreciated. Unfortunately Bianca was not able to attend the December assessment but she is very keen and more than ready to undertake the next assessment.

Our equipment is in a great state with a much needed fully stainless steel trailer delivered in December 2018-this should outlast most of our members I reckon, thanks to Richard Dowling for organising and Chris Buhler for making what is a fantastic beach trailer. We also purchased another new Yamaha IRB Motor in January 2019. The club has also purchased some Surf Rescue wetsuits which will be greatly appreciated by drivers and crew on those colder days. Thank you to everyone who supports the IRB operations from assisting with training and equipment maintenance to ensuring the fuel supplies are always available (Mike) to working your magic with Grants and financing. JUNIOR ACTIVITIES REPORT

2018/2019 was an excellent season for Nippers at South Narrabeen, and one of consolidation and new initiatives.

Net enrolments landed at 73 Nippers, which was lower than the previous (and a recent record) season of 91. This was due to a combination of factors, including migration/departures of some older nipper families, and a lower intake of U-6s. Nevertheless all age groups were active throughout the season with the largest representations coming from the U-10 and U-13 age groups.

This season we looked to formalise the surf skills process in accordance to the SLSC guidelines. This resulted in our Nippers receiving Surf Play, Surf Aware, Surf Safe and Surf Smart awards. This is a big step in ensuring that our Nippers are adequately skilled as they journey systematically through to becoming qualified surf lifesavers. A huge thanks to Sarah Oaten for helping drive this, and all the patrollers and Age Managers delivering the training.

Age Managers also embarked on the online Age Manager certification. We are still striving for 100% completion, which we intend to do by the time the 2019/2020 season commences. We had about 10 Nipper parents complete the CPR course, allowing them to support the patrolling teams.

We also saw healthy numbers for early morning board training, where we averaged about 10-15 Nippers per session. This has become a highlight for this group of Nippers who are very keen to continue building their board skills. Much appreciation to Darren Sue, Andrew Ivering, Lexie McKinnon, Mark Southan, Joe McNulty and all other parents who have dedicated the Sundays to make this a key and consistent component of Sunday Nippers.

FINANCE REPORT

It gives me great pleasure to present the financial statements of South Narrabeen SLSC for the year ended 30th April 2019.

The following were the highlights:

Operating surplus for the year was \$10,292.62.

Kiosk/Cafe

The kiosk operated for the full season and generated a surplus of \$30,900 for the Club. The kiosk is now the cornerstone of Club finances.

Donors and Grants

A full list of all donors, sponsors, grant income and gift income is included in the detailed income statement notes.

Significant contributions included:

- The 2018/2019 Surf Club Facility Grant program, administered by the Office of Sport. The Club applied for and was successful in its application to build a new Training Room, Staircase and Awning (DA2018 0446). The Club was awarded \$252,420 for this project. The project must be completed by August 2020.
- Community Building Partnership. The Club was awarded \$22,825 towards the build of the OVR awning. This project must be completed by May 2019.
- Beach Safety and Equipment Grant. The Club received \$5,000.
- Local Sport Defibrillator Grant program. The Defibrillator is to be mounted upstairs in the OVR.

Other Income Highlights

- Membership subscriptions held steady
- Golf Day in its fourth year raised \$950.
- Club BBQ raised \$2,500.
- Hall Hire was down but consistent with other years, net income of \$19,885

In summary

The Club is in a sound financial position with cash on hand of \$178,205 an increase over the previous year of 45% or \$55,260.

The Club has the capacity to cover its short term liabilities with its current assets, more than 4 times over when you deduct the facility grant.

The Club's equity position (member's funds) stands at \$504,723. This figure is representative of the amount of capital investment the committee has made over the past 10 years and continues to make, in improving building, gear and equipment, plus cash available after you take into consideration its debts.



Martin, Jack and Ted made short speeches, Phillip O'Connor made a short speech, he spoke highly about Brewarrina and congratulated the kids and carers on their behaviour, as well as complementing them on being great role models for their community, we then heard some wonderful Didgeridoo music, back to Sport and Rec and off to bed.

Bill Edwards


Bill joined South Narrabeen SLSC with two brothers Max & Jim.

Harry Walkden

DOB: 16/04/1928

Harry grew up in the Narrabeen area, where his family were active members at North Narrabeen SLSC. They recognised the difficulties of patrolling the beach between Narrabeen and Collaroy.

Harry father and Uncle (Allen and Don McLean) were instrumental in existing South Narrabeen Surf Life Saving Club. Both actively involved in establishing the club that we know and love today. Harry was an active member of the club from a young age, and provided many years of active service.

Harry was a member of the rescue and resuscitation (R&R) team that won the Australian championships in 1945-46, he was 18. The following is a snippet from the 1945/46 Annual report.

It was not until the season was more than half-completed that our R. & R. Team got together, and it speaks much for their success that they had very little competition practice. The team comprised: R. Beer, A. Carrier, F. Collins, A. Fidler, H. Walkden and M. Whitehead; and, under the expert guidance of L. McDonald, they eventually won the Australian title, carrying with it the Surf Association's Premiership.

Extract from the 1945/46—23rd Annual Report.

Harry was a respected member of the club.

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
