Annual Report, 1947-48

To the Members, S.N.S.L.S.C.

Gentlemen,—

It is appropriate that this Report, covering our activities during the 1947-48 season, should coincide with the Silver Jubilee of the Club, for as will be seen from the various phases that this Report covers, South Narrabeen has reached the highest standard of proficiency in Life Saving ever recorded in our history.

As further details are given later on in the Report, the Committee at this stage confines its remarks to an expression of confidence in the ability of the members, with the cooperation of all concerned, to have an even better season in 1948-49.

SURF LIFE SAVING.

It cannot be too strongly emphasised that we are not a sporting organisation in the ordinary sense of such a term. We are in the peculiar position of being a body formed primarily and principally with the humanitarian object of rendering assistance and service to those of our fellow men who partake of the healthy and invigorating pastime of surf bathing.

The beach was efficiently patrolled by sixty active members from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. during each Sunday and public holidays under the efficient supervision of our Club Captain, A. Brown. Twelve patrols of five men were appointed under the direction of Patrol Captains, and the relentless vigilance exhibited by all members is reflected in the fact that only ten rescues (five with belt and five without) were necessary. The Club is again proud to report that our unblemished record of "NO LIVES LOST" has been maintained.

A specially prepared Patrol Book proved to be of inestimable value, and an obligation rests with the 1948-49 Patrols to maintain the prevailing accurate recordings. Personal Patrol Cards, setting out the roster of each patrol member, were issued. This innovation proved to be a pronounced success, and it is suggested that the incoming Management Committee recommend continuance of this practice.

The call to members for strict adherance to patrol duties was cheerfully answered; laxity in patrol attendance proved uncommon, and on no occasion was disciplinary action necessary. This strongly indicates that the patrol system is established on a solid basis, and it augurs well for a smooth functioning patrol machine in the future.

FIRST AID.

In this sphere A. Todd was prominent in re-organising our Casualty Room, and bringing it up to its present high standard. This contributed in no small way to the efficiency with which 24 cases were treated.

We wish to record our appreciation of the assistance given on several occasions by our Hon. Medical Officers, Drs.

J. R. Black and J. R. Waddell.

Our thanks also go to Mr. W. Fairley, of the Narrabeen Pharmacy, and Mr. R. Mayhew, of Johnson & Johnson, for their generosity in donating first aid materials.

It is gratifying to note that the steady increase in memmership has been continued. At the same time, your Management Committee has carefully scrutinised each nomination and has periodically checked the existing membership in order to ensure that our ranks will be composed of men willing to carry out their duties.

GEAR.

Several valuable additions to the gear have been made during the season, notably the acquisition of a new surf boat, which was built by N. and E. Towns, and delivered to the Club in March. For the major portion of the cost we are indebted to Mr. Appleroth, of Aeroplane Jellies.

Another long-felt want that has been satisfied was the purchase of an amplifying system, which in no small manner

has added to the efficiency of our life saving work.

A number of improvements has been made to the interior of the club-house. Included in these are extensions to the gear room, re-modelling and re-painting the shower room, and fitting burglar-proof bars to the windows of the office. For this work we are indebted to the efforts of Messrs. Cunningham, Biggs, Hill, T. Le Clerc, Homer, Kirkwood, Childs, Woodward and Pailthorpe.

The rest of our life saving equipment has been kept up to its usual high standard. In this regard special mention is due to N. King for his work in the re-painting of club reels, and to A. Lawrence for maintaining a strict supervision of

our gear.
