Annual Report, 1948-49

To the Members, S.N.S.L.S.C.

Gentlemen,-

Your Committee has much pleasure in presenting this, the 26th Annual Report, covering the activities of your Club

during the 1948-49 season.

There has been a steady influx of junior members during the season, and this, combined with the keenness of the older brigade, has resulted in a most successful year. Indeed, it could be faithfully said that the Club has reached unprecedented heights in many respects, mainly due to the team spirit that has been displayed.

At this stage your Committee does not wish to elaborate on the various phases of the Club's activities, as fuller details

are given throughout the report.

SURF LIFE SAVING.

It is, indeed, pleasing to report that the proud record of "No Lives Lost" on South Narrabeen Beach has been maintained.

During the season 1948-49 fourteen rescues were per-

formed, ten with a line and four without a line.

A strenuous effort was made to educate the general public to bathe between the safety flags and to obey the commands of those empowered with authority, and the results achieved indicated that the surfers who frequented the beach were most willing to co-operate.

A patrol system, embracing 12 patrols of 5 men, was placed in operation, and the beach was efficiently patrolled from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. each Sunday and public holiday. The vigilance exhibited by patrol members generally can be regarded as satisfactory, but evidence of laxity by a minority

was observed.

South Narrabeen Club has acquired a reputation for efficiency over the years, and a high standard of work must necessarily be expected of every man. It should not be necessary to remind members that club membership involves an obligation of patrol punctuality and efficiency, and any slackness in this most important sphere of the club's activities

must be viewed very seriously. Now that the numerical strength of the club is increasing, the opportunity should be seized by the Management Committee to eliminate any recurring blemish associated with patrols.

The issue of Personal Patrol Cards, indicating the hours of duty of each member, again proved to be an unqualified success, and a continuance of this practice is recommended.

FIRST AID.

Forty-eight cases of first aid were recorded during the season, many of which were minor. Once again the Club is appreciative of the energy displayed by our Hon. Ambulance Officer, A. Todd. However, it is felt that more care and enthusiasm should be shown by the members in general, as this is one of the most serious phases of our work.

We wish to record our appreciation of the assistance given on several occasions by our Hon. Medical Officers, Drs.

Waddell, Rosati and Black.

GEAR

The Club is in a most fortunate position with regard to its gear. For this we can thank our loyal supporters for their generosity during the season, and also the success which rewarded our efforts in inter-club carnivals. In these regards the outstanding acquisitions were those of a fully equipped March Past reel, donated by Mrs. A. Parsonage, and the "David Jones' Boat," won by our members for competition against other Clubs throughout the season. In addition, a number of lines and belts was purchased.

The rest of our life saving equipment has been kept up to its usual high standard. In this regard special mention is due to our Gear Stewards, Messrs. A. Lawrence, W. Reynolds and B. Ingram, for their maintenance and supervision of our gear. The "Aeroplane Jelly" surfboat has been kept in excellent order, and should give many years of faithful service to the Club.

The present structural condition of the Clubhouse leaves much to be desired, and our Hon. Architect, Mr. G. Yates, is at present drawing up plans for considerable improvement to the building. We feel sure that we will have the Shire Council's sympathy in this project, for the Club feels that it cannot progress much further under the present restricted conditions.

Individual events won by the Club during this period were numerous, special mention being due to R. Jackson (beach), B. Moloney (surf), and our old stalwarts, A. Fidler and M. Whitehead, who have done so much to keep the Club to the forefront.

This year for the first time the Acme Cup, contested by all Clubs from North Palm Beach to Dee Why, was held on our beach, and we were successful in retaining the trophy after a very exciting finish from our neighbouring Club—

Collaroy.

As a fitting climax to a most successful competitive season the Club's March Past team won the coveted trophy of a set of March Past costumes, presented by Life Savers Ltd., to the winning March Past team at a spectacular competition, held during the Royal Easter Show.
