ANNUAL REPORT. 1951-52.

Gentlemen, ---

Your Management Committee takes great pleasure in presenting to you this report, which briefly sets out the Club's activities during season 1951-52.

This is the 29th Annual Report of the Club, and it will be seen that the downward trend in membership, which was brought to notice at the conclusion of season 1950-51, has not been arrested. Difficulties arising from this decrease in membership are explained elsewhere in this report, together with full details of our activities in other spheres.

SURF LIFE SAVING.

It is with great pride that we are able to announce that our primary object, i.e. the effective safeguarding of the surfing public at South Narrabeen has been achieved and our record of "NO LIVES LOST" maintained.

The efforts made by Club Captains, Jack Bressington and Bill Edwards towards this end are deserving of special mention. A shrinking membership, heavy absenteeism during the Christmas period and continuous call on competitors, all contribute to make the Captain's task of maintaining patrols a most unenviable one. The two officers concerned applied themselves tirelessly to the task, but members must realise that the responsibility for efficient patrols lies with the individual, and it is only by the full active co-operation of each member that our responsibility to the public as a Member Club of the Surf Life Saving Association will be fulfilled.

FIRST AID.

Our First Aid Officers, J. Edwards and J. Burke, treated many minor cases of first-aid during the season. Although the Club spent a good deal of money on medical supplies it has proved most difficult to supervise expenditure in this connection, and continued care must be exercised by members to prevent wastage.

The Club is grateful to our Honorary Medical Advisers, Drs. Black, Rosati and Waddell for their ready assistance at all times.
