SURF LIFE SAVING

For the Season ending, our Club is able to report that 'No Lives were Lost' whilst voluntary patrols were carried out by Club Members. The high ideals of 'Vigilance and Service' have been maintained and the principles on which the Club was founded have been actively pursued.

The Patrol Efficiency Competition conducted by the Manly Warringah Branch has helped to improve patrol efficiency throughout the area. Our Club did not finish as well as it has in past years. Each member should reflect here on his attendances throughout the year and should endeavour to do better in the coming Season.

A total of twenty-seven rescues were performed by members and these were as follows:

As any of these rescues could have resulted in 'lives lost' it serves to highlight the absolute necessity of 100% patrol efficiency and attendance.

Members in the vicinity of the Club, and those about to start patrols, armed two reels and went to the point where the two persons were in difficulties. The rescue in operation and the two patients were brought to the beach after much difficulty with kelp on the line and the slipping of the belts by the patrol men. It was at this juncture that Paul went to the assistance of a Club Member and struck the same difficulties, his line was brought to the beach laden with kelp.
